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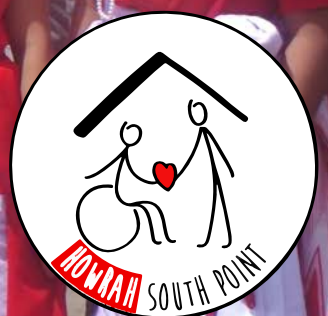
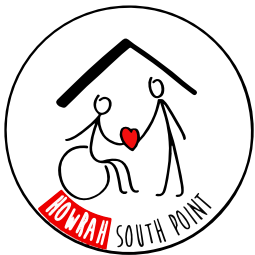

### ACTIVITIES

- Physically challenged including hearing impaired children and socially challenged children attend regular Govt. schools.
- Mentally challenged children attend HSP Prognalaya Special School.
- Orthopedically challenged children receive physiotherapy sessions on regular basis.
- Mentally challenged children receive psychotherapy sessions regularly.
- In addition, children get lessons in drawing, dancing and singing as a part of co-curricular activities.
- The staff focuses on teaching the challenged children to learn to manage daily living activities, personal hygiene, social behavior and language communication.
- Most important is Activities of Daily Living (ADL) with the mentally challenged, severe cerebral palsy, severe multiple disability and autistic children.
- Our children participated in local dance competition.

### ACHIEVEMENT

This year 3 children (2 girls orthopedically challenged) have passed Madhyamik examination.

### CELEBRATION

We celebrated and enjoyed many celebrations with participation of all the children : Teacher's Day, Children Day, Saraswati Puja, Basant Panchmi, 15th August, Roksha Bandhan and Rabindra Jayanti etc.

Our St. Mary's Home welcomes socially and disabled children. The different type of disabilities are: cerebral palsy, mentally challenged, physically challenged, orthopedically challenged, hearing impaired and multiple disabilities. We look after them, try to understand their problem and also what they want to do. They share their difficulties with us.

#### CASE STUDY

One mentally challenged girl, Neha Parveen, age about 12 yrs. and three months came to our centre. At that time she could only sit and crawl. She had behavior problems. She had no toilet habit and was always shouting random noises. Always somebody had to feed her. Now she can eat by herself. She now knows her home. She can come downstairs by herself. She understands what didis and dadas are saying. She has improved very much. Her behavior problem is also less important than before. Now she can walk alone.

## LALKUTHI HOME

In the year 2017 total children were 48. Out of 48, 6 children successfully finished their final exam. After farewell from Lalkuthi Home they have gone back to their native place.



This year (2018) there are 42 girls. All go to local school.



**ACHIEVEMENT**

- Three children of class 9 and five students of class 10 received bicycle from their school. After the final exam, the children and staff celebrated their farewell on 21.3.2018.
- Six children from Ashaneer came to Lalkuthi Home on 18.7.2017. Riya Paul, Riva Kumari, Roshni Hansda, Lalita Hansda, Falguni Das and Alisha Tigga. Now they are doing well. They are improving in their studies, dance and singing.
- Three new children from Asansol were admitted to Lalkuthi on 21.2.18. Ria Gorai, Gulabi Kisku, Nikita Marandi. All are going to local primary school and are doing well.

After one year he has been admitted to Formal School. Now he is in class IV and has high rank in his class.*



## EKPRANTANAGAR (EPN) HOME

E.P.N (Ekprantanagar) home is especially for the destitute children. During this year (2017-2018) there are 72 children (Boys - 47 and Girls - 25 ).

## Outreach program (Outdoor physio post)

Howrah South Point conducts outreach programs through its outdoor physiotherapy posts (physio posts) in the Howrah district. Children with disabilities from the localities neighboring the outdoor posts come regularly to the units for physiotherapy sessions.

In addition, at the physio posts, children are given special education.

During home visits, staff members counsel the parents; guide them to get Disability Certificates for their children and; help them to get aids and appliances for the disabled through Disability Identification Camps. The improvement that we have observed in some of the children as result of the services rendered through the different physio posts encourages us to work hard in perseverance with each and all.

### OUTDOOR PHYSIOTHERAPY POSTS AT HOWRAH

There were 4 outdoor posts at the beginning of the year :

- Ashaneer
- Lalkuthi
- Shibpur
- Tikiapara

The Shibpur and Tikiapara posts closed during the year, in October 2017 and March 2018 respectively.

### NUMBER OF STAFF

In our Physiotherapy Department there were six staffs but at the end of this year in the month of

March, Mrs. Juthika Kujur has retired.

### NUMBER OF CHILDREN

This year, 141 needy children received regular physiotherapy treatment at the Shibpur, Tikiapara , Ashaneer and Lalkuthi Physiotherapy centres of Howrah. Besides physiotherapy we have taught parents how to do physio at home. For appliances we send them to our workshop in Lalkuthi and sometimes to Mahavir Seva Sadan in Ekbalpur.



## Creches

Crèche is a day care centre for children of working parents & single mothers. The centre takes care of their health, nutrition and education as well as their emotional, social and cultural needs. The children get daily meals, and immunization is also done. There are three crèches at Howrah Branch.

#### APPLIANCES

- Ashaneer: Two children with cerebral palsy, Puja Malia and Ayushman Baehar have received A.F.O from Mahavir Seva Sadan in Ekbalpur.
- Lalkuthi: Three children with cerebral palsy have received gaits from Lalkuthi. One boy with cerebral palsy has received special chair from Lalkuthi,
- Shibpur: Two girls with cerebral palsy got gaits from Lalkuthi.

#### TREATMENT

- Shibpur: Two children affected with rickets have completed their treatment.
- Tikiapara: Four children affected with rickets have completed their treatment.

#### CASE STUDY

• **Ayushman Baehar (Ashaneer)** – When a boy with cerebral palsy, named Ayushman Baehar, 2 yrs. old, came to our centre he was always in 'w' sitting position. After two years of physio with him, he is able to sit, crawl and stand with the support of parallel bars.

• **Puja Malia (Ashaneer)** – When a little girl, 3 yrs. old, came to our centre she was in lying position. After one year of physio with her, she is able to sit and crawl alone.

• **Majda Khatun (Lalkuthi)** – One 4 yrs. old girl with cerebral palsy was unable to crawl or stand and her speech was not clear. After one year physio with her, she can crawl alone and stand with the support of parallel bars or wall. She speaks clearly!

• **Rohan das (Lalkuthi)** – A 3 yrs. old boy with cerebral palsy was always crying and did not want to do physio, today he is able to sit alone and stand with support. He can speak few words like – Mama, Papa and Dada etc.

## BISCO BRICK FIELD

## BAKSARA

Baksara crèche has 8 children of different age groups from 3 years to 7 years old. Their parents are daily labour, they leave their children at 9 am and take them back home after their work. ; Children are taught the basic lessons of numerical, alphabets, drawing, games and action songs.



In this crèche, 22 children between 15 days to 2 years old are kept in a suitable room lying on mats or in cradles. The crèche gives much relief to the working mothers. We provide proper nutritional diets to the children. They socialize with others through various games, singing, dancing and others forms of activities. Those who have difficulty in movement, are taught with aid of learning materials such as charts and pictures besides engaging in action songs giving them much needed entertainment and group feeling. Within few months these children are able to learn necessary knowledge on daily life activities. They are also taught hygiene.

## EKPRANTANAGAR (EPN)

In this crèche, there are two staff and 13 children within the age group of 2 to 4 years. Every morning they take breakfast followed by a game session. After that, they start to study and learn dancing and singing. Daily they have different kinds of routines. After class they take lunch and at 4pm everyone goes back home.







# EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Education is the best means for elimination of poverty and superstition in a society as it brings the light of knowledge and wisdom. Education is the force that can eradicate injustice and slavery from the social order by bringing in equality, liberty and fraternity. We are indebted to our donors for their continuous support and kindness which will ensure bright prospects for our children. ## DISCIPLINE

School Headmaster and teachers try their level best to keep the students engaged in study and discipline. Here, there is no punishment to the children by either beating or scolding. All are taught with love and care.

## BRICK-FIELD

- Non-Formal-School in brick-field is seasonal from the month of November to mid-June. Brick-field activities are stopped during the rainy season.
- School hours are 6 hours per day, 6 days a week.
- Our students are children of migrants who have never been to school or have dropped out.
- We follow-up the syllabuses of Bihar, Jharkhand and Madhya Pradesh states to give the children a chance to continue their studies upon return to their native states.
- Parents bring their older children to take care of the toddlers. We enrol them as students and look after the 1 to 2-month-old babies in a homely crèche.
- The strength of children is 50 in three groups and 20 in the crèche.
- Mother come feed their babies from time to time.



**CASE-HISTORY**  
*Manisha Sordar, female baby, 15 days old. Mother From the State of Jharkhand, Jhorna Sordar and her husband came to work in Brick-Field with two children, Piyus 6 years old and Nisha 8yrs who are studying in our Non Formal brick-field School. Jharna gave birth to her third child, Manisha, in Brick-Field. After 15-days she brought Manisha to our centre and asks us to take care of her baby. One of our staffs, Helen Sebastian, took care of Manisha as her own daughter. Mother Jhorna leaves her work from time to time to feed her baby. All our Didis, show their tremendous love and care when they choose to work in this field, lacking basic facilities, of Non Formal School. On 12th June, Manisha a 6-month healthy, charming baby went back with her family to Jharkhand.*



**REPUBLIC DAY' 2018**  
Republic Day is celebrated every year on January 26 to honor the date on which the constitution of India came into effect in 1950. Like every year, our school organized a beautiful flag hoisting program with the help of our little children and our teachers. # ANKURHATI



### CASE STUDY

Md. Sahi 6 years old boy, son of Md. Waqil and of mother Saniya Bibi is residing under a tent of plastic, straw & bamboo at Bartala-Ankurhati, on unauthorized land. Md. Sahi with his parents was begging door to door & picking things from garbage to sell and to manage their daily lives till the mother, Saniya Bibi, came to our Non-formal School to admit Md. Sahi to start his learning. Md. Sahi now can write & read alphabet, he feels proud and with other children cheers & enjoys the day.

- Non Formal School in Ankurhati has 6 hours classes, 6 days a week from January to December.
- From 5 years to 14, girls and boys are enrolled.
- Migrants and dropout children can enrol whatever the period of the year.
- After home-visit, children found roaming and labor children are admitted in our non-formal.
- Eight children after Non-Formal have been admitted in our Formal School at Baksara Vidyalaya. They go by bus to Santragachi, 13 km. away and then walk one km to Baksara Vidyalaya.
- Children are following the syllabus of Baksara School and appear in exams.
- A 5 years child found begging with parent took admission in May.
- In Ankurhati there is no Hindi medium school so children are eager to come in our non-formal school.
- Free dry-food provided to our children 2-times in a day with biscuit/muri & chanachur. There is one day egg/bread.
- On Saturday it is drawing/songs/health & hygiene classes for the children.
- From time to time, the children of Ankurhati admitting in Baksara ask and get help for their homework.



## BRIDGE-COURSE (EPN)

- There are 6 hours of school in Bridge-Course per day, 6 days a week except holidays.
- 44 children enrolled this year. They are working children, migrants and dropouts.
- 21 children were admitted to EPN formal school. Those who remain are late starters and continue in Bridge Course.
- After home-visit, children found unable to pay formal school fees join the bridge-course.
- Children of poor family with parents who have not enough time

to attend to them, due to daily labour, are eager to come to school.

- Republic Day, Rabindra Jayanti, Sports Day are celebrated
- Combined with Mid-day meal, light dry food is provided daily to the children.
- There are no Hindi medium schools in the locality, so children are taught Hindi, English, math and follow the school syllabus to be ready to join formal school in the next session.
- On Saturday special classes for songs/story/drawing/health & hygiene
- After small break & after lunch children like to play.
- This year in sports, prizes were given to children by bridge-course staff under their own arrangement so to encourage more efforts.

# BAKSARA

- Baksara Non-Formal-School has 6 children.
- For 4 months, it did not function due to lack of space to make the children sit.
- After a home-visit in Katepol, we found several dropout children. Now the classes of non-formal school are running in the veranda of Baksara crèche. Children from different communities are found in Bandh, Dhakhin Baksara who do not attend classes anywhere. Most of them are interested to come but it is far from HSP and difficult in rainy season too.



### CASE STUDY

Md. Irfan, a boy, 11 years old had never been to school. From childhood, he can't see from one eye. He is very-much interested to learn and start his schooling. His mother, Sitara Begum showed her happiness and surprise when our Didi came to her door to request her to send Irfan to Non-Formal School. The very next day when she did not come with her child, our staff called Sitara Begum by phone and she answered that without her, Irfan never come out of the house. After 2-days, she came with Irfan with exercise copy and pencil. She spent 2 hours and found how our staff love the children. She then told Puspita Didi, in your care I drop my son. Now Irfan is regular, mix-up with other children and enjoy the activities in Non-Formal School.

**CASE STUDY**  
*Sonia Soni 7 year's old girl belongs to Ankurhati, Nimairhati, Domjur. Her father expired on January 2017 in an accident. Her mother rented a home and found it very difficult to provide for her 2 daughters. She came with Sonia for admission in Ankurhati Non-Formal-School. After six months Sonia had made progress in alphabet and number counting. Today, with the help of the Non-Formal School Coordinator, she got admission in the Bridge-Course and in the HSP residential home at EPN.*

Special School

The Prognalaya special school within Ashaneer Home, in Andul Road - Halder Para, is dedicated to children who need special care due to their special need and ability. Most of the inmates are from very poor segments of society though some are from a middle-class background. This school has three schedules. Total students are 77 among them 21 from Ashaneer home and 56 from Outdoor and new admission - 10.

- We use various kinds of learning materials for the kids. More and more children are motivated to join this school.
  - Apart from their studies, students showed improvement in motor development skills and occupational, functional, speech therapy, sound discrimination and self-help curricular activities.
  - A large number of children have joined the nearby primary schools.
  - Besides studying, they attend “Meditation” classes, which were started in January 2018.
  - Most students took part in speech, language and audio therapy classes.

CELEBRATION

• **Independence Day** - Like every year on the 15<sup>th</sup> of August we celebrated Independence Day in Ashaneer Home. Our chief guest Rev. Fr. F. Laborde hoisted the National Flag at Ashaneer. Our Secretary Mr. A.R.A. Sah gave the speech on that day. We planted trees and the celebration ended with the distribution of sweets to all children and staff.

• **Children’s Day** - We celebrated children’s day on the 14<sup>th</sup> of November 2017. Sister Santana Cyntliya from St. Mary’s convent school participated with her school children. They gave lunch to our children and sweets and bananas to all our children and staff. Our children enjoyed the program and they did a small program too.

• **Teacher’s Day** - In India Teacher’s Day is celebrated each year on the 5<sup>th</sup> of September to pay homage to our selfless teachers. This day is also the birth date of our former president Dr. Sarvapali Radha Krishnan who requested we celebrate this date in honor of our teachers. The children’s parents participated by organizing fun activities for the teachers, which they really appreciated. It was wonderful celebration and ended with sweets and beautiful gifts for all the teachers.

• **World Disabled Day** - The 3<sup>rd</sup> of December is the International Day of Persons with Disabilities – also known as “World Disabled Day. We celebrated this day with an entertainment program which included an inclusion massage. Like every year we arranged an awareness rally program. This year it was within the Ashaneer complex because some students were feeling physically

unwell. So it was incomplete rally. But students enjoyed it very much, with indoor games and the distribution of fruits and sweets.

• **Saraswati Puja** - 22nd January 2018 was Saraswati Puja. It is different kind of program which is jointly arranged by Ashaneer home and Prognalaya Special School. Everyone wore colorful clothes and enjoyed it very much. It was a meaningful occasion to discover about those who were not lucky, but whose smiles are a gift of God.



• **Annual Sports** - On the 9th of February 2018, Prognalaya Special School hosted an annual sports meet. The day was filled with fervor, excitement, amidst thrills and cheers. The chief guests of the day were the Chairman of Howrah Municipality, the honorable Mr. Arbind Guha, and HSP’s own Father Laborde, as well as other authorities. The day started off with a lovely opening prayer. Honorable Chairman Mr. Guha thanked all the teachers and staff for their co operation and support and advised children to keep up their spirit. Parents, staff and indoor children also participated on that day. At the end of the days, students departed with a clear smile on their face. It was a day filled with enthusiasm and memories to cherish.

CASE STUDY

Shyam Sankar is a 6-year-old boy who was admitted to Prognalaya Special School in July 2015. He has hydrocephal (a condition in which fluid accumulates in the brain) and cerebral hemiparesis (weakness of one entire side of the body) disabilities. His right leg and hand was deformed due to the disorder.

When he came to school, his knee joint was weak. As a result he could not walk. When he was 2 years old he was operated for his hydrocephalus disorder. With

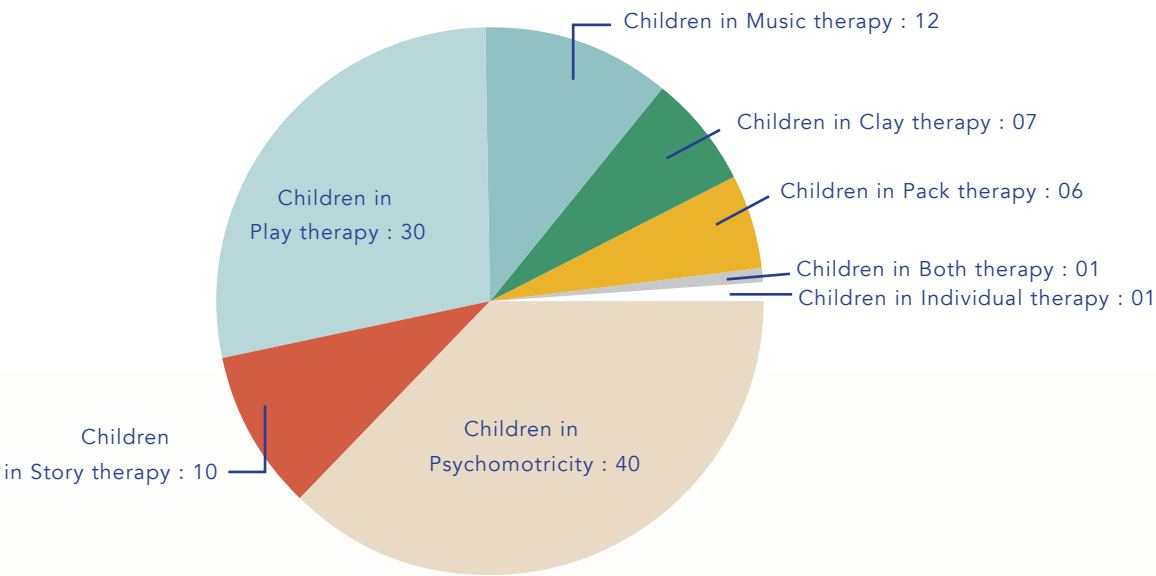
regular physiotherapy and With the help of a caliper, he is in a better position with increased physical mobility and strength. At present with the use of normal shoes, his movement is just as normal as others and with it he has increased his mental confidence.

When Shyam Sankar came first to school, he did not have the power of communication skills. He used to communicate by gesture, eye contact and some time with few word or sound. After speech therapy and special training at our school his com-

munication skills have improved. Now he is able to sit up for a long time, able to take part in group activities, is able to do primary needs of life on his own. He is able to play with toys, able to recognize common colors, objects, academic activities etc. He used for daily living and has increased enthusiasm in life.

He is very happy and has motivation to continue to learn. His parents are very proud for transformation of their child. Now they bring him regularly to school.

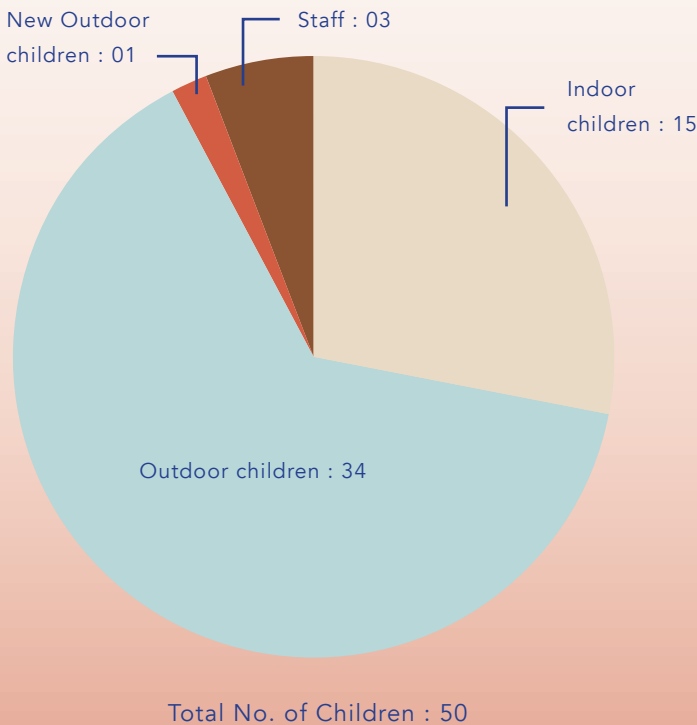


ACHIEVEMENTS

Psychotherapy

STATUS OF PHYSIOTHERAPY DEPT.

The Psychotherapy department is a special and totally different department in Ashaneer. This unit is free expression and psychological treatment. Different categories of children are coming who needs different therapies. This department is generally supported by French psychologists . This year, two of them: Diane Prodel and Elsa Leconte came to this Dept. They work with us and also properly guide and teach the children. Activities : 1. Clinical Psychological method with various tools. 2. Outdoor training for 2 days. 3. Discussion with children through Skype with Psyvi institution. 4. Advise specific needs of psychological problematic children. By this way process both of us gathers experiences.

CASE STUDY

1. Debjyoti Halder - Debjyoti Halder is 7 years old. Hydrocephaly and Autistic feature child. He came to this Dept on 9 th April, 2016. Generally he has changed a lot. Earlier he had big separation problem. He had difficulty in following the therapeutic border. He always likes good distance. He was difficult to the ground activities. Not only this he always created peculiar sound "ga", "ga" with anger. Though psychomotricity he has learnt to socialize and is able to create relationships. He remains quiet while taking his massage. Because this the-

rapy is relaxing he is quite. Not only this, he can do spatial movement activity and follows the instructions. So psychotherapy team and parents are happy and satisfied.

2. Ajima Khatun - Ajima Khatun is 14 years old with mental disability and autistic feature. She came to this dept. on 15 th February, 2016. In the beginning she had too much passivity. She always stayed alone. She was difficult, could not create relationship with others. She also had difficulty in speaking words. She liked to sit in front of the mirror and laughed

meaninglessly. Sometimes she avoided eye contact and was stereotyped. Beside this she ate her clothes mindlessly. By coming to psychomotricity and music therapy, she has changed a lot. She has learnt to socialize to accept presence of staff. She remains quiet while taking massage and also participates in group activities. She responds to Didi / staff calling. These therapies help her express feeling and find a way to solve her problem. It is less stereotype passivity. So the change is because of these therapies. Parents and psychotherapy team are happy and satisfied.

There are 5 mobile dispensaries in Howrah, Kolkata and 24 Paraganas: Foreshore Road dispensary and Chengail dispensary in the Howrah district, Topsia dispensary in the Kolkata district, and Santoshpur dispensary and Bhojerhat dispensary in the 24 Paraganas district. Each day two mobile dispensaries are run in two of the afore-mentioned dispensaries. There are 5 German Doctors volunteers, and 30 staff members split in two teams, every day examining around 80 patients. Our dispensary activities are as follows:

**EYE CAMP**  
We organize eye camp every two months. There patients are getting pre operation and operation facility, free of cost.

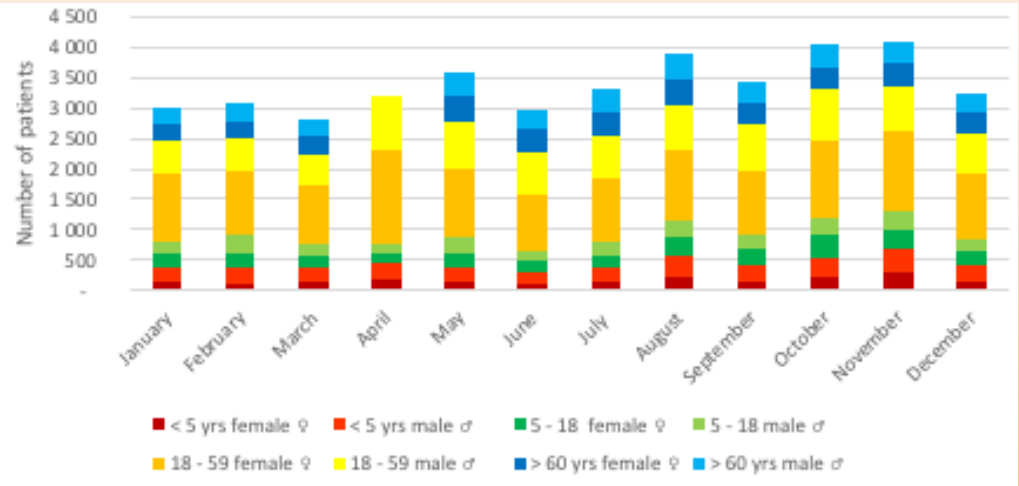
**DIABETIC CAMP**

# Pushpa T.B Ward

Pushpa T.B ward started their work in 2007. All kinds of T.B patients are treated here. Their age level is 0 to 18 years. Patients are coming from different urban slum areas where our Mobile dispensaries are situated. This T.B unit is running with the collaboration of Howrah District Hospital.They provide us medicine for our patients.

There are two important components of T.B patients. One is medicine and the other is nutritious food. Patients stay here in a welcoming atmosphere. During the initial phase, they are suffering a lot from physical problems. During this phase we emphasize mostly on medicine, food, loving care and support which are most needed.

After, when the patient has improved we gradually involve them in studying. Different kind of teachers are teaching them. Patients have much talent. They can draw nice pictures, so we arrange drawing teacher to help them. They learn songs, dances and sometimes perform in our cultural programs.

In the year 2017 – 2018 total patients treated are 59, Among them male patient-18(31%)and female patient-41(69%) as shown in Fig- 1&1a. There are two kinds of T.B. One is Pulmonary and other is Extra Pulmonary. No. of Pulmonary T.B was 16 and no. of Extra Pulmonary T.B was 39 (Fig – 2) RNTCP category T.B in to four parts (Fig – 3 )

Then Sputum culture and drug sensitivity test done. Result shows drug resistance. Then started MDR medicine on 14.1.2018. After some days patient has many physical problems and not improved. Again test done. Then started XDR medicine on 12.2.2015. After started medicine she has improved . But suffer lots of problem like loss of appetite, insomnia, irritation etc. She feels that she never cure again. But our counseling, nutritious food, love, care and support gave her a healthy life. She is cured. She discharged on 1.3. 2018 after a long treatment . Now she is at home and leads a normal life.



# Malnutrition Children Ward

This ward is for children with all kinds of diseases, but especially for children suffering of malnutrition. These children are sent to us from our mobile dispensaries. Common diseases are treated here, for surgery and emergency cases patients are referred to various government hospitals or specialists. We provide a special diet for these children. They improve and heal under our love, care and support. We provide the following services

- 1 - Regular checkup of pediatric consultant and RMO.
- 2 - Proper and nutritious food.
- 3 - Referral service.
- 4 - Follow up.

Here patients stay with their mother. So our focus is their mother. Most are illiterate. They don't know how to take care of their children. Therefore we arrange training sessions for them, such as:

- 1 - Importance of Breast feeding.
- 2 - Hygiene maintain.
- 3 - Complementary food.
- 4 - Nutritious food with low cost.
- 5 - Family Planning.
- 6 - Child rights etc.

Her father and grandmother are both handicapped. At the age of four, she was brought to our home for her better development and education. She is now studying in Nursery and is brilliant in her studies.*

OTHER RELEVANT MATTER

- **SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME-** Howrah South Point provides scholarship to 110 students, who are from very poor families of the local area to continue their studies. This scholarship is provided every month to them.

- **SPECIAL HELP**  
The Special help of Rs: 50 per month is given to the aged women and widows who are above the age of 50 and also to the disabled persons from the local area.

SCHOOL

The name of our school is Kalipathar Hindi Primary School. It is a Hindi medium school from Nursery to class V. There are 105 students in our school among them 75 students are from our home and 30 students are day scholars from the local area. There are five teachers in our school. The books and copies for the students are provided by Howrah South Point as well as other necessary things regarding studies like pen, pencils, rubber, etc. The students are also given tuition and scholarships to help all the way.

CELEBRATIONS

- On the 15<sup>th</sup> of August, we celebrated Independence Day. We decorated the whole home and school campus with the National Flag. After a grand march pass performed by the children the National flag was hoisted by our chief guest Mr. Mayank Agarwal followed by National Anthem. He also distributed chocolates and sweets to all the children of our home and school.
- The 5<sup>th</sup> of September, we celebrated Teacher's Day with great pomp and joy. We also offered prayer to our beloved St. Mother Teresa on her death anniversary on this day. The children organized programs for the teachers of our home and school. They performed dance, song, poems, drama and offered us a memorable teacher's day.



SPECIAL EVENTS

- The 26<sup>th</sup> of January, on the occasion of our '69th Republic Day 'we organized our 'Sports day'. The children's were divided into groups for the events like 50 m race, 100 m race, sack race, spoon and marble race, skipping race, etc. The winners of these events were awarded with prizes according to their 1st, 2nd and 3rd position. The Unity Indian Group was also present on this day for their kind support and help.



CASE STUDY

• *Babita Singh is a day scholar student. Her father's name is Dileshwar Singh and mother's name is Shobha Singh. She lives in Dhanudi, Jemari. She studies in class I . She is a very intelligent and hardworking student. Last year she was not so good in her studies but this year she has improved and got the 2nd position in class - 1.*

• *Rohit Hembram is also a day scholar student and lives in a nearby village called Bathanbari. His father's name is Babulal Hembram and mother's name is Malati Hembram. He is also a very intelligent student of our school. He is in class II. He scores very good marks every year and makes us feel proud.*

# Homes for the physically & socially challenged children

## JORDIGHI HOME



Howrah South Point Jordighi Handicapped Children Home was set up in 1987 (though it was functioning at another place offered by the Bishop of Jalpaiguri Diocese from 1983) at its present address Vill.-Jordighi, Post-Mohitnagar, Dist-Jalpaiguri-735102. The home is registered under Justice Juvenile (Care & Protection of Children) Act 2015 for the Boys with Special Need (CWSN) till 31st March 2021.

### ACTIVITIES

Jordighi Centre has 4 wings.

- Childrens Home
- Branch Office
- Orthopaedic Workshop
- Farming

### CHILDRENS' HOME

Jordighi Home is financially supported by donation from Hele Avus Foundation, Berlin, Germany. This home is for the rehabilitation and education of differently able children coming from poor and marginalized families. Children are mainly orthopaedically challenged (Cerebral Palsy, Congenital Malformation) and socially challenged boys, age group from 10+ to 18 years and reside in three units according to their age and class. All are attending formal school from class V to Class X in three different Govt High schools outside of the home. Jordighi home welcomed 5 boys during the year. One is new Admission and 4 boys from HSP Mogradangi Home after they completed their class IV.



### EDUCATION

7 boys presented the Madhyamik Exams in Feb 2018 and all have returned to their families. (Results came out in May 2018, and all 7 boys passed successfully and took admission for Class XI)

They learn drawing (making greeting card paintings), singing, gardening to develop their imagination and creative skills. Basic Computer training is also given to them. Few boys are interested to learn carpentry and leather craft work.



### REHABILITATION

For their rehabilitation physiotherapy is given everyday morning from 8 am to 10 am except Sundays and National holidays. Also the children from the surrounding locality are coming for the physiotherapy.

### CELEBRATION & PARTICIPATION



Residents celebrated Netaji's birthday (23/01), Republic Day (26/01) and Independence Day (15/08) with flag hoisting and patriotic songs. On Republic Day (26/01) the Respected Additional

District Magistrate, Jalpaiguri paid his valuable visit to our Jordighi Home and offered sweets packets to all the children. Rabindra Jayanti / Teacher's Day was celebrated with songs, dances and drama. For Holi Festival they put colors on each other and had a lot of fun.

10 boys participated in a drawing competition on the 20<sup>th</sup> of August 2017 organised by "Sishu Kishore Academy" with the co-operation of District Information & Cultural Dept. Jalpaiguri on "Ekatai Sampreeti". The District Magistrate of Jalpaiguri

inaugurated the program. Three Jordighi boys-Bholanath Marandi, Bekrant Oraon & Manab Roy participated in District Level wall painting competition at Jalpaiguri town. They were







selected by the Jalpaiguri Zilla Parishad to paint walls for the "Toilet in each House" 'Swachha Bharat' Campaign and won the Special prize. On the 13<sup>th</sup> of November 2017, a drawing competition was held at Jordighi home among the home children for Children's Day. 6 boys bagged the prizes in two categories. 10 boys also participated in Rangoli competition in which they painted the road near Teesta Garden with oil paint. All boys attended the cultural program at the town club hall on the 14<sup>th</sup> of November. All these were organised by the District Administration-District Child Protection Unit (DCPU), Jalpaiguri, on the occasion of Children day. On the 17<sup>th</sup> of December 2017, 5 boys from Jordighi Home participated in 'MUSKAN the Annual Sports meet for the disabled organized by NBCD, Siliguri and most of them won prizes.

#### RENOVATION

The entrance road of Jordighi Home was greatly damaged. It was repaired with the help of road contractor Mr. Jayanta Ghosh.



#### OUR FRIENDS AND VISITORS

Maryse Favre came to visit along with her grand daughter Miss Elice Favre to Jalpaiguri. A French Psychologist, Elsa came for 6 months at Bakuabari Manus Domini Special School. She oversaw group counselling for teenage children at Jordighi.

Once again, we welcomed our dear friend Pascale Cochet from France for one month. During her stay at Bakuabari she shared her experience, knowledge, ideas with the physiotherapy team. She checked the children with physical needs & gave training accordingly. We are thankful for her help through her presence and experience.

Alibaba from Switzerland and friend of Giuliano Uncle paid his visit at Jalpaiguri Centre. He is travelling by his car throughout from Switzerland! Jordighi boys were very much interested and excited to share his experience.

Like the previous years Giuliano Minisini from Switzerland came to Jalpaiguri. During his stay he visited all our centers and organized picnics.



Jordighi Orthopaedic workshop began in 1992 and started to function in full swing in 1993. This workshop was started to provide calipers to our differently abled children in all the four homes at Jalpaiguri. This workshop has Two wings- i) caliper workshop ii) shoe workshop. Two technicians

oversee this workshop. Calipers, special chairs, moulded seat, corner seat, splints, parallel bar, modification of wheel chairs, special shoes, gaiter and other orthopaedic appliances are being prepared from the workshop. Besides fulfilling the needs of our four homes,

Jordighi orthopaedic workshop is now well known as a Resource Center in supplying orthopaedic appliances to the individuals in this region. Besides new productions, number of repairing work has been done for the calipers, wheel chairs, special chairs, Surgical shoes etc...

#### FARMING

We have some cultivated land adjacent to the home where we produce paddy and vegetables. Thus we can get the fresh vegetable and fruits like lichi, jackfruit, guava, banana etc. We have cows (to get milk), poultry birds (to get eggs), goats, pigs. We have a pond where we get the fish. All these are for the utilisation of the children.



### MARIA BASTI HOME

This home was established in 1982. It hosts 14 challenged girls of 15 years and more, of whom 9 are orphans. Most of them have multiple disabilities,

epilepsy and some are severely handicapped. Residents of this home do a lot of activities such as taking care of animals like goats, assisting in the vegetable garden, taking part in the vocational activities like jute work, candle making, incense making, and embroidery etc.

Also, they help in doing the domestic works like cleaning the house, cutting the vegetables, washing the utensils in the kitchen. They can do each and every work, there is nothing to critical for them. They are not expert in everything; but still, they try to manage to their best. This year they have been enlisted in Mahatma Gandhi Rural Employment Scheme and worked with other job card holders in the area.

On the 8<sup>th</sup> of March 2018, there was picnic with all the residents at Bengal Safari, Siliguri sponsored by Malavika Byanwala, Siliguri. It was a memorable day for all the residents. She also donated one month's requisition of grocery and toiletry items for them.





# MOGRADANGI HOME

Introduction: Mogradangi Home is situated at Rajganj block in Jalpaiguri District, in a small Village between Siliguri and Jalpaiguri.

### ACHIEVEMENTS

- 8 students have successfully passed the Primary examination this year. 4 boys were transferred to Jordighi Home and 4 girls to Bakuabari Home to get admitted into class V in Government Schools. 4 destitute children went home. Government rules have changed, therefore all girls moved to Bakuabari. From now on there will be only boys in Mogradangi Home. Now admission of children is by permission of CWC, Jalpaiguri .

*During this year 2018 at Present – 27 boys  
New admission – 12 boys  
Children are living in this center in four different groups under the care of the didis and dasas.  
  
The big boys unit- age from 10-12 year.  
The small boys unit-age from 6-9 year.  
The special care unit age -from 5-12 year.  
And there is a medical care unit with trained and experienced nurse.*

### CELEBRATION

World disabled day was celebrated at Bakuabari near the Bandhunagar market on the 3rd of December 2017, with an awareness rally held by the challenged children, their parents, and members of staff. Tiffin and lunch was distributed at the end of the event.

### ACTIVITIES

The home takes care of 27 children. 8 children go to Bakuabari for special classes, and the rest study in Shanti Rani Primary School, which is inside the compound. The home children receive phyiotherapy from 8am to 10am from Monday to Friday and formal education from the Shanti Rani Primary School from 10:30am to 4:00pm.

### SPORTS

The children participated in the North Bengal Annual Sports meet for the disabled at Siliguri, in the Kanchanjangha stadium, Darjeeling on the 17th of December. Some children won prizes and they all enjoyed the sports.

### PICNIC

Mogradangi Home children and indoor dasas and didis had a picnic inside the Home and all B/B home’s children were invited to the picnic.This picnic was arranged by uncle Giuliano. They had lots of fun, with delicious food, playing and dancing.

On the 19<sup>th</sup> of November 2018, 4 German doctors visited Mogradangi home. They brought games, a car mat, a laptop and some tiffin for the children. On the 5<sup>th</sup> of March 2018, uncle Giuliano stayed in Mogradangi home during 1 month. He gave dedicated service in the solar, a TV dish, some gifts, and money to buy Horlicks for the weak children.

### CASE STUDY

*C.P (Hemiplegic) Rakesh Roy is 10years old . He came from Dhupguri Dist – Jalpaiguri (WB) . He lives with his parents. His father is a daily wage worker and his mother is a house wife. He has one elder sister and two brothers. He was admitted in Mogradangi home in 2016, with equine foot deformities and delayed development. He suffered from asymmetrical weight. He was very quiet and obedient. As a resident of HSP, he received regular physiotherapy, and was provided with an ankle plaster for foot correction and special A.F.O. shoes. He now has better balance, but still requires regular physiotherapy. He is studying in Shanti Rani Primary School in class II. He is helpful with his friends and is happy.*

# BAKUABARI HOME

Bakuabari is a special home equipped for the care of cerebral palsy, mentally challenged, multiple disability, locomotor disability and autistic children. The home is in the Jalpaiguri district, 20 km from Siliguri, beside the National Highway. The home was created in 1984 for the Jeevan Path community. Gradually it has expanded, and now caters to three communities:

**JEEVAN PATH** is a community of adult orphan men with cerebral palsy, autism, multiple disabilities or other mental disabilities. There are seven in total, all suffering from very severe physical and mental disabilities. Three adults came from Missionaries of Charity Kolkata, two from CWC Jalpaiguri. Two were living in the street from an early age. They are aged between 25 and 50 years old.They need lot of care for their Activities of Daily Living(ADL). Most of them take anti epileptic and psychiatric medicines. They are gradually less capable due to their age and difficulties. There are three dasas and one didi taking care of them. They are committed to making paper packets, cleaning and taking care of their own daily activities. They enjoy watching Television, FM radio and Mobile. Some of them have battery free mobile and like to speak with others.







**NIRMALA NIVAS** is a special home for mentally challenged, cerebral palsy, multiple disability, autistic and slow learning children of 5 to 12 years old. There were 35 children enrolled this year. There were 10 didis taking care of the children 24 hours a day, and helping the children

in their daily activities. We help them to become independent in their daily activities such as speech, feeding, drinking, toileting, brushing, bathing, dressing and moving. We provide them with good care, keeping them happy with playing, music, TV, games, singing and dancing.

**BIG GIRLS** is the community for the girls with locomotors disabilities (Congenital deformities, Cerebral palsy, Polio paralysis, burnt contracture, fractured etc). They are 27 girls from 10 years to 19 years old and studying class V to X at Harihar High School. They are taught by two tuition teachers for Science, Maths and English. They learn vocational activities such as jute work, tailoring, needle work, gardening and kitchen work according to their choice. They also learn dancing and music. They participated in different activities as sports, dance competition etc. There was a big change in Bakuabari Home. Due to the order of the Supreme Court implemented by the DM of Jalpaiguri that all male and female residents of more than 6 years of age should be separated, 20 girls from the primary section of Mogradangi Home were transferred to Nirmala Nivas.



*It is difficult to adapt for the children due to infrastructure and the special school at Bakuabari. It takes lot of time to go to comeback and less time for special attention and training. But anyway we have to adapt to the situation.*

#### ACHIEVEMENTS

There are two girls Puja Tudu and Puja Marandi, both are destitute and from tribal family from Assansol. The resident of Bakuabari Big Girls passed Madhyamik Exam (school Final) 2017 successfully Puja Tudu in first division other in second division. This year 7 girls appeared for Madhyamik 2018. The girls won the champion trophy of North Bengal Sports Meet for the disabled 2018 at Siliguri. Two girls completed the state level vocation Training for Tailoring.

## SHANTI RANI PRIMARY SCHOOL MOGRADANGI

Shanti Rani Primary School was established in 1981 in Mogradangi village under the Rajganj Block of Jalpaiguri, adjacent to the children's home. The handicapped children of Mogradangi Home and local children attend classes, from Nursery level to Class IV in Bengali Medium. Total strength this year was 626 students. There were 97 new admissions and 101 pupils were transferred to other schools to be admitted into High School. Children actively participated in drawing, music and computer lessons every week.

#### MOGRADANGI HOME SOLAR PV

3 KWp photovoltaic panels were installed in January 2015. The purpose was to save on electricity bills by connecting to the power grid. But for a grid connection, 2 more KWp panels were required. After a long wait to complete the project, in October 2017, 3 more panels were installed and the grid connection was done. Now an average of 15-20 volts is produced daily. Thanks to members of Indian Project, Switzerland for their guidance & financial support.

#### CELEBRATIONS

All four homes of Jalpaiguri celebrated the 23<sup>rd</sup> and the 26<sup>th</sup> of January with marches, flag hoisting and patriotic songs, before parading through the village Bakuabari Home with posters and banners.

#### RE-ORGANISATION AT JALPAIGURI

On the 22<sup>nd</sup> of December 2017, a big change was made for Bakuabari and Mogradangi homes. To run a home it is compulsory to register under the Juvenile Justice Act of 2015. According to this act, boys and girls must not reside in the same compound with a common entrance. Therefore, Bakuabari Home is now only for girls, and Mogradangi Home for boys. Both homes have a capacity of 50 children. Jeevan Path were sent to the Day Center, the vocational training center at Bakuabari Dosh Bigha

#### ANNUAL SPORTS

On the 17<sup>th</sup> of December 2017, children of Jordighi, Mogradangi and Bakuabari homes participated in MUSKAN, the annual sports meet for the disables organized by NBCD of Siliguri. Most of the children won the prizes. Besides that the girls group bagged the runners' trophy.

Manus Domini Special School in Bakuabari organized its annual sports day on the 15<sup>th</sup> of December 2017. All the school children along with the children from Outdoor Post physio center also participated. The Sabhapati of Rajganj Panchayet Samity attended the sports and distributed the prizes to the winner.

#### CO-OPERATION OF GOVT

Manus Domini Special School received grants for Festival Garments, Shoes and Bags from Mass Education Department West Bengal.

The block administration of Rajganj sanctioned pond digging work at Bakuabari, and Bay leave plantation under MGNREGS. Bay leave plantation project was allotted to the residents of Jeevan Path.

#### LOCAL ASSISTANCE

Puja garments distributed among Children of Bakuabari Home by Akhil Bhartiya Mahila Mandali Siliguri and for Mogradangi Home children by Mrs Kiron Periwai and her family members. School Uniform for 45 children distributed by the women group from Siliguri.

#### WORLD DISABLED DAY

This year we have celebrated the day with parents. All the children didis and dasas from Bakuabari and Mogradangi homes gathered at a place near Bakuabari Home and besides the national highway and the Bandhunagar bus stop. The children from our outdoor physio centre also joined with their parents. There we organized a small cultural programme where the children sang and danced.





## SHIKARPUR SCHOOL

Shikarpur Non Formal School started in the year 2010 at Fatinga line, Shikarpur Tea Garden to give support in education to children of Tea Garden workers. During the year 76 children attended the school, 13 have passed class IV level exam and could get admission in local High Schools. Teachers guided the parents through admission procedures, and continued to monitor them regularly.

In the month of November health checkup conducted by local Health centre. In the month of July an eye check-up by Lions Club, Siliguri has been done. We were providing a cooked midday meal since July 2013 to all students, which was discontinued by the authorities. Now we are providing dry food (Puffed Rice, Parched Rice and Chanachur) to Children. We hope Block Administration will review the situation and support us.



### RENOVATION OF SCHOOL

The roof of the Shikarpur School was bamboo thatch with plastic sheet. So very often it was affected by storm and heavy rain and it was difficult to continue the classes. We applied to Block Development Office at Rajganj and Rajganj Panchayet Samity renovated the roof with corrugated tin sheets. On the 4<sup>th</sup> of November 2017 the renovated school was inaugurated by the Block Development Officer, Rajganj, MLA of Rajganj, Sabhapati & Panchayet Pradhan. The children are happy for the new development of their school!

## Outdoor Physiotherapy Posts

In Jalpaiguri, outdoor physiotherapy posts opened in 1999 to serve the children in need. There are 2 outdoor physio posts, one in Rajganj and another at the Binnaguri Gram Panchayat Office. During this year, outdoor staff rendered services to 102 children aged 45 days to 19 years.

Children receive Physiotherapy, necessary aid & appliances, guidance to get Government documents, enrolment in Manavik Scheme and disability certificates. Staff conducted home visits every week to collect information about families and to train mothers on how to handle their child at home. Two awareness programs on early intervention were conducted during this year for parents.

8 Children with congenital malformation (CTEV) were identified and treated with serial plasters.

Three children with cleft and palate malformation were operated at Surgery Camp in 2017 and are waiting for follow up.

## Surgery Camp

The 18th cleft lip & palate surgery camp was organized from 5th Nov to 23rd Nov 2017. Total 39 children were treated with the support of Pro-Interplast, Germany, at Goodricke Group hospital, Chalsa.

The children with Congenital Tibial Equino Verus (CTEV) foot deformity have been corrected by Serial Plaster cast. This winter we have completed 17 children serial plaster and provided Boots and bar. 9 children are under this treatment. Pro-interplast Germany supported cost of materials
